



Students are responsible for any course-related fees, depending on specific classes/programs.

Students enrolling in Level 1 (Certificate) and Level 2 (ADN) Nursing classes have a separate cost sheet; available from the Allied Health Sciences Department.

ROOM & BOARD:

- Room and board contracts are available on an annual basis only for students beginning in the fall, unless special conditions apply. Semester plans are available in the spring.
- All students living in the residence halls are required to purchase a meal plan.
- Room and board fees are billed on a semester basis and are due prior to move-in, unless financial arrangements have been completed.

- Books and supplies
- Cost of housing















FEDERAL STUDENT AID PIN 1998-2015

- May be used by students and parents throughout aid process, including subsequent school years



Submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)

- Website: <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u>
- FAFSA on the Web Worksheet:
 - Used as "pre-application" worksheet
 - Questions follow order of FAFSA on the Web

Good reasons to file electronically:

- Instant access to FAFSA applications
- Built-in edits to prevent costly errors
- Skip-logic: skip unnecessary questions
- Use IRS Data Retrieval Tool to import tax information

- Timely submission of original application and any necessary corrections
- More detailed instructions and "help" for common questions
- Simplified process for corrections and future applications

IMPORTANT: Complete the FAFSA prior to starting college

- For the Summer 2016 term, the 2015-16 FAFSA may be filed now.
- For the 2016-17 academic year, the 2016-17 FAFSA may be filed beginning January 1, 2016
- NEW! For the 2017-18 academic year, the 2017-18 FAFSA may be filed beginning October 1, 2016

FAFSA: When do I file?

Beginning with the 2017-2018 FAFSA, students and parents will use PPY income information.

- Submit the FAFSA Earlier as early as October 1 rather than January 1
- Use Earlier Income Information Students and their parents will report income from prior-prior-year taxes. For example, the 2017-18 FAFSA will use 2015 income information rather than 2016 income information.
- Receive Award Letters Earlier Know the estimated costs and financial aid available to pay those costs at your school of choice

PPY: Prior Prior Year

Social Security Number OR
 Alien Registration Number
 (if a non-U.S. citizen)

- Records of untaxed income (if applicable)
- A Federal Student Aid ID (FSA ID) to sign FAFSA electronically.

- Income Information:
 - Federal tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned. Bank statements and records of investments (if applicable)
- Dependent students will also need most of the above information for their parent(s).

FAFSA: What will I need?

- Available early February 2016 for 2016-17 processing cycle
 - Electronic Returns: Up to 3 weeks after filing
 - Paper Returns: Up to 11 weeks after filing
- Participation is voluntary
- Reduces documents requested by Financial Aid Office

IRS Data Retrieval Tool (DRT)

Some users will be unable to use IRS DRT. Examples include:

- Filed an amended tax return*
- No Social Security Number (SSN) was entered
- Student (or parent) married but filed separately
