LOCAL SCHOLARSHIPS—SCHOLAR LINK

ERMA E. ALLDREDGE SCHOLARSHIP - first on record for Class of 1998

Mrs. Alldredge was a former school teacher who valued education and put tremendous effort into encouraging young people to seek further education. The Alldredge Scholarship recipient and alternate will be selected using the following criteria: 50% by financial need, 25% by GPA, and 25% by participation in activities. *An education major is preferred*, but not limited to in case of no qualified applicants with this major.

ANDREW CLIFFORD ARMSTRONG SCHOLARSHIP - first on record for Class of 2004

This scholarship should be given to a senior who plans to attend college and obtain a degree in education. A high moral character will be a primary consideration, along with scholastic achievement and need. *An education major is preferred*, but not limited to in case of no qualified applicants with this major.

FRANK AND MARJORIE CARROLL SCHOLASRHIP—first on record for Class of 2016

This scholarship was created by Frank and Marjorie Carroll in support of one SHS senior in continuing their education.

PAUL E. DANIEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP – re-established in December of 1993(awarded in 1990 & 1991)

Paul E. Daniel was the proprietor of Daniel's Supply Store, a hardware store of the east side of Stanberry's square. His interest in and generosity towards education has created this scholarship for a high school senior who will continue their education.

CLORETTA L. DANIEL MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP – re-established in December of 1993

Cloretta L. Daniel was an elementary school teacher for over 35 years and taught in the Stanberry R-II system. Her love of education continues in her creation of this scholarship.

FREDERICK W. SCHNEIDER SCHOLARSHIP - first on record for Class of 2004

The Frederick W. Schneider Scholarship will be awarded to a student who *must attend Northwest Missouri State University*.

BULLDOG PRIDE SCHOLARSHIP—first of record for Class of 2020

This scholarship will be awarded to a senior who plans to continue their education.

ALVA B. and NINA FAYE HUGHES SCHOLARSHIP - first on record for Class of 1987

The student may attend a four-year college or vocational school. High school applicants must have a "B-" grade average. The selection committee will be appointed in March at the local School Board meeting and will consist of a Board member, a teacher and the guidance counselor.

RAYMOND JENNINGS SCHOLARSHIP – first on record for Class of 1990

This scholarship winner *must attend Northwest Missouri State University* and be of good moral character. No special major is required. The recipient will be judged in the following manner: 50% by financial need; 25% by academics; and 25% by participation in activities. The selection committee will be appointed in March at the local School Board meeting and will consist of a Board member, a teacher and the guidance counselor.

PHIL GRAY MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP - first on record for Class of 2023

The recipient will be judged in the following manner: 1. financial need; 2. Dependability, citizenship, and work ethic. The selection committee will consist of 2 community members, a male teacher, a female teacher and the guidance counselor. There will be 1 male winner and 1 female winner.
